Cyfrinfa Marc Dewi Sant **Banner Dedication**

fter the months of meetings and preparation and unending organisation, we were finally there the Consecration Meeting of our new Lodge

It is the ambition of every Lodge to dedicate a Banner and Cyfrinfa Marc Dewi Sant was no exception. The catalyst was a very generous donation by the Dewi Sant Craft Lodge and the fact that it had also quite recently dedicated its own Banner. Some very generous donations from elsewhere, meant that the membership was quite easily able to fund the difference.

The Banner design was put in the very capable hands of Bro. Roger Thomas. He came up with a few designs, each an improvement on its predecessor, and with the valuable advice of V.W.Bro. Jeff Clarke,



a very impressive design was finally agreed. Eirian Jones, PSGD, Deputy PGM and founding Senior Warden of the Lodge was the Dedicating Officer, and, as would befit Cyfrinfa Marc Dewi Sant, the ceremony was conducted mainly in Welsh.

As is the custom in Mark Masonry, Ladies and non-Mark Masons were invited and took their place in the Temple, whilst the Worshipful Master, W.Bro. Geoffrey W. Thomas opened the Lodge in an Ante-Room and then calling it off, before entering the Temple in procession.

After the Worshipful Master had welcomed guests and visitors, W.Bro. Eirian Jones and his team entered in procession and took the Chair. Having appointed his Officers, he then addressed the Lodge on the Nature of the occasion. Banners were



originally set up as a means of identification, a rallying point in time of battle or distress, or as a focus of loyalty, and also as a symbol of the mystical relationship between the tribe and God. This is a custom continued even to the present day.

The Dewi Sant Banner depicted a Keystone, to focus our thoughts, and to advance our Masonic knowledge. The Centre of the Banner was Black with a yellow cross, depicting the flag of St David. He yhencongratulated the Lodge on securing a Banner so early on in its development.

A deputation was formed and the new banner was paraded into the Lodge and unveiled. It was then paraded three times round the Lodge, at the conclusion of which, the Dedicating Officer presented the Banner to the Lodge

The Worshipful Master, W.Bro. Geoffrey W. Thomas, then resumed the Chair and the Dedicating Officer and his team retired in

After the National Anthems, the Worshipful Master and his Officers retired from the Lodge to the Anteroom where the Lodge was called back on and Closed.

There followed a very impressive afterproceedings which rounded off a very memorable evening.


