In early 2002 a group of Mark Master Masons lead by Edward Morgan became interested in forming a Mark Masters Lodge for Past and Present Provincial Mark Stewards. On the 20th June 2002 a meeting of the interested Brethren was held and the decision made to form a Lodge under the name of 'South Wales Mark Provincial Stewards Lodge'. After many trials and tribulations and with the assistance of the Provincial Secretary, Jeffery Clarke, all the requirements for forming a new Lodge were completed.

On the 12th March 2003 the new Lodge was consecrated at the Bridgend Masonic Temple in the presence of 80 Mark Master Masons. The Consecrating Officer was Desmond Barnett, Provincial Grand Master of the Province assisted by the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Paul Clement and the Assistant Provincial Grand Master Anthony Moore together with the full Provincial team including Michael Howell the Provincial Director of Ceremonies who directed the ceremony.

At the end of the consecration ceremony the South Wales Mark Provincial Stewards became Lodge number 1829 under The Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of England and Wales and its Districts and Lodges Overseas, to the delight of the founders. 
