

As most of you will know John Pring suffered a heart attack one year ago. After leaving hospital he was restricted to riding his bicycle for ten minutes per day. Those of you who know John will realise how restrictive this was to him.

However, this riding time was gradually increased until a few months ago, when John was given the all clear to ride as much as he wished, but to 'train not strain'.

On hearing this good news he decided to undertake a sponsored cycle ride in support of the 2004 Mark Festival. He now cycles almost every day with his wife Jill who is a great support to him.

During the summer he undertook a 350km mountain ride over part of last years Tour of Spain course, completing this in five days. Then in the autumn he completed a four day ride to Cartegena and back - a distance of 260km.

He has set himself a target of 5000 miles before the first of July 2004 and to date is on target.
