John was Advanced into Afan Lodge of Mark Master Masons on 20 January 1969 becoming its Worshipful Master in 1980. He received Provincial Honours as PPrGSwdB and received Grand Rank PAGStdB



in 1997. Promotion followed in 2004 as PGJD and in 2015 to PGJO. In Royal Ark Mariners he was Elevated in Dunraven RAM Lodge No.950 in 1969 and later became Founder Junior Warden of Afan RAM Lodge in 1978, becoming its Commander in 1980. He received Royal Ark Mariner Grand Rank in 1993. He was also a Founder and Commander of Middlesex St David's RAM Lodge No.1063.

In the Craft he is PPrSGW and in The Holy Royal Arch PPrGSN. In the Ancient and Accepted Rite he holds the rank of 32° and is a Founder Member of both Abaty Margam and Neath Rose Croix Chapters. John obtained Grand Rank in Royal and Select Masters and now holds the rank of PG Conductor of the Council.

It was not a surprise when he received a request for financial support from the Port Talbot Town Cricket Club. The Club has a number of players who play disability cricket and not only have they represented their own club, Port Talbot, but have also represented their country by playing for the Welsh Disabled Cricket Team.

The problem they were facing was



that the area in front of their club house, due to the ravages of time and constant use, had become unsuitable for wheelchair users. A full restoration was required in order to make the area wheelchair friendly, by providing a ramp and eight wheelchair friendly accessible benches thus enabling the disabled cricketers easy access to the Club House.

The South Wales Mark Benevolent Fund was more than happy to assist and although they were not expected to meet the whole cost, £500.00 was raised to provide the building materials to enable the ramp to be completed in time for the 2019 season. This was matched by a local builder and two of his workforce, who provided their labour free of charge.

The Club, one of the few in Wales to promote disability cricket, provides this amenity free of charge, with senior members of the Club supporting the disabled section by covering fixture costs.

A Note for Your Diary


