After the meeting many visited the Temple with great




excitement and curiosity. Many questions were asked and much interest shown.

New Honours Board for Arthur Lewis Royal Ark Mariners Lodge No.585

n Friday, 8 November 2019 on a cold and damp night in Pontypridd, the Members of the Arthur Lewis Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners were delighted to receive their new Honours Board. How did it all start?

On 12 February prior, the Warder Bro Vincent Barker, was outside the Temple discharging his duties. During the Ceremony he contemplated on why Arthur Lewis Mark Lodge had an Honours Board but not the Royal Ark Mariners Lodge?

Following the Ceremony, he tackled the Scribe and inquired why this anomaly existed. He replied that the cost of such a board to the Lodge was not financially viable. Vince was then informed that The Mark Board was presented previously by a Brother of the Lodge. He again challenged the Scribe to find out the cost of a board for the Mariners' Lodge.

Over the next couple of weeks, a local supplier for a board and someone to do the artwork and lettering were located and the cost established. Prior to placing the order, permission was sought from the Pontypridd Masonic Hall Board of Directors, who readily gave their assent. Vince immediately requested the Scribe to go ahead and proceed with the order.

Thus, the keel for the new board was laid down. During the summer months, the framework was constructed, draft layouts considered and the final design details and wording forwarded to the sign writer.

With the project under way, the Provincial Grand Secretary was informed and asked to liaise with RWBro Thomas Richard Eirian Jones, Provincial Grand Master, to request his presence to dedicate the board on its completion. His agreement was confirmed and it was planned to include this at the Lodge Installation Meeting where this rare Ceremony would take place.

On the evening of 8 November, Worshipful Commander WBro R Alan Jones opened the Lodge, the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies WBro Alun H Thomas was admitted and announced that RWBro Thomas Richard Eirian Jones the Provincial Grand Master was in attendance and demanded admittance.

Following salutations, the Provincial Grand Master, requested that he retain the gavel for the purpose of dedicating the Honours Board. Placing the Provincial Wardens, Deacons, Guardian and Warder in their respective positions, he requested the Provincial Director of Ceremonies to escort the Worshipful Commander and his Wardens from the Temple to form an Escort Party for the Honours Board ready for the Dedication Ceremony.

WBro R Alan Jones and Bro Vincent Barker re-entered the Temple bearing the Honours Board between them escorted by the Senior Warden Bro R Gwyn Morgan and the Junior Warden Bro Arnold Hutchings.

The Dedication of the Board took place in a very inspiring and meaningful manner with much solemnity, prayers and zeal culminating in the Provincial Grand Master soliciting Alan Jones to accept it on behalf of the Lodge.

Following the Dedication, Alan Jones resumed control of the Lodge and proceeded to Install Gwyn Morgan, Senior Warden and Commander Elect as the Worshipful Commander in a consummate manner.

This article would be incomplete if it did not convey the



unquestionable fact that the Brethren of the Lodge will be eternally grateful to Vincent Barker for his far sightedness and generosity in funding the Honours Board.

The Board is now on display in its rightful place on the wall adjacent to the Mark Honours Board, at the entrance to the Temple in Pontypridd.

The Mark of the Dragon

A comprehesive history of the Mark Province of South Wales

n important book is being published this year to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the formation of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of South Wales – which is the oldest Mark Provincial Grand Lodge in Wales and one of the oldest in Britain.

This is the first time that a book has been published which brings together in a single volume a detailed description of the birth and development of every Mark and Royal Ark Mariner Lodge that has ever existed within the Province of South Wales.

Make sure that you obtain your copy of this fascinating hardback publication, which features some 340 pages and over 200 illustrations, as a valuable source of information and a souvenir of this historic occasion.

Like all good stories, the early history of the Mark Province of South Wales reveals a number of interesting if not - at first sight - puzzling situations which are explained in the book. The first of those puzzles is that, although, in 2020, we are celebrating the 150th anniversary of Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of South Wales, the Mark Degree was being practised in this part of Britain long before that date.

Although the Mark Degree was being conferred in Wales in Craft Lodges from the early 1800s, it was not until 1859 that the first Mark Lodge was Consecrated in the Principality. However, that particular Lodge, based in Cardiff, was initially not part

The Promise made to Noah - The Degree of the Royal Ark Mariner

by: Roger Lewis f all the Masonic Degrees that a Freemason may join, there are few so beautiful and personally instructive as that of the Royal Ark Mariner Degree. The world today seems to be full of turmoil with misfortune and tragedy befalling many in our society. This Degree bids the Candidate to reflect on how he can play an integral role in society, both local and further afield and help those in need.

This underlying philosophy is analogous to the story of Noah and the Deluge. Here Noah strives against seemingly insurmountable odds to save his family and others by building an Ark, much to the ridicule and derision of his contemporaries. The dangers of the flood to those who scorn become apparent in the story and Noah and his family are successful in escaping the flood.

The fact that Noah himself faces extreme difficulties in both his personal life and his relationship with God and often disagrees and argues with both God and his family, further links Noah with today's Society. Noah, however, with the strength of his family and personal conviction succeeds. This is at the centre of the Mariner Degree, where the difficulties and dangers of the flood are metaphors for the dangers and tribulations of daily life which may be faced.

The emblem of this Degree is the dove and the rainbow and each member wears a multi coloured ribbon against a silver rainbow above a dove with a leaf in its mouth. This reminds us of the Mark Grand Lodge for England and Wales, having been Consecrated under the Scottish Constitution.

The second - at first sight puzzling fact is the fact that South Wales had a Provincial Grand Master, appointed in 1857, before it had any Mark Lodges, let alone a Provincial Grand Lodge. Things changed in 1870 when the Province came into existence (albeit with just one Mark Lodge).

The next fifty years were difficult ones, but the Province

overcame those challenges and today it numbers thirty-three Mark and twenty-three RAM Lodges and it continues to grow. In addition, along the way, the Province gave birth to nine Mark and five RAM Lodges which later formed the nucleus of what is now the neighbouring Mark Province of Dyfed.

that the rainbow in the sky after rain is a permanent reminder of God's Covenant with Noah never to repeat the Deluge.

Although this Degree is administered by Mark Masons' Hall and every prospective Candidate must be a Mark Mason, there is no connection with any other Masonic Degree and its full title is 'The Ancient and Honourable Fraternity of Royal Ark Mariners.'



To commemorate the 150th Anniversary of the Mark Province of South Wales the Provincial Grand Master would like to see the current membership increase. At present only fifty five per cent of Mark Masons in this Province are also Members of the 'Mariners'.

To this end, each Mark Lodge will appoint a Royal Ark Mariner Representative, who will expand and strengthen the link between the Mark Lodge and its allied Royal Ark Mariner Lodge and hopefully increase its membership.
