### PPE Supplies from Mark Masons’ Hall

Our Provincial Grand Secretary, WBro Martin A Jones on discovering that PPE equipment was available from Mark Masons’ Hall, decided to obtain a supply and distribute them to the Vale of Glamorgan Council Covid-19 Crisis Support

Team, the Barry RNLI and local care workers.” Martin is a Member of Barry Lodge of Mark Master Masons.

We are all aware of the government’s continued endeavours to provide PPE across 58,000 separate organisations, including care homes, pharmacies, and GP surgeries. Many of you will have also read about the exceptional efforts of some Freemasons using 3D printers to produce PPE in the form of full-face visors.

Thanks to the ingenuity and benevolence of a Member of the Mark Province of Kent, Grand Lodge has been supporting an initiative to provide Provinces, wishing to participate, with a reasonable supply of full-face visors for onward distribution to those in need locally. The Member’s manufacturing business has designed a plastic injection mould capable of producing up to 2,500 plastic visors per week.

### Assistant Provincial Grand Master Assists in Distribution of Meals

When Cardiff Masonic Hall decided to offer its catering facilities by supplying daily meals to those who were experiencing difficulties, WBro Philip W Davies, Assistant Provincial Grand Master was quick to respond. Philip immediately offered his services and transported 63 meals and made 18 trips to a great number of Brethren on a daily basis.



Philip writes; “It was a great privilege to offer Mark support to this Craft initiative thus illustrating in a practical way that all Masonic Orders are indeed members of an all-encompassing fraternity.

I met many Brethren who were not members of a Mark Lodge, many of whom I would not have met under normal circumstances and it was a delight to assist them in these difficult times”

Mark Masons have been active in assisting those in need during the pandemic. The Cascade Foodbank in Penpedairheol benefitted from donations from Caerphilly (£200) and Scouts Cymru (£50) Lodges of Mark Master Masons.

The Mark Benevolent Fund has also generously supported activities across the Province. The South Wales Craft Square Meals initiative in Cardiff received £1,000 and the foodbanks in Neath, Port Talbot and Swansea received £250 each.

He also thanked all Brethren who contributed to ensuring the Gala Dinner would have been a great success.

The pandemic did not stop everything from happening, albeit not in the way that it was planned. Two events which have been celebrated are outlined below.

### Provincial Grand Master Announces South Wales Mark Benevolent Fund Total

The South Wales Mark Benevolent Fund total was to have been announced at the Gala Dinner. This was inaugurated at the Provincial Annual Meeting on 6 June 2012. The then Provincial Grand Master, RWBro Paul R Clement, stated his wish to launch a charitable appeal programme to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the Province in 2020. Our current Provincial Grand Master was the Chairman of the Appeal Committee. The key part of the project, later to become known as the 2020 Appeal, was to raise money for charitable purposes to support our Brethren in the Province and their families. In view of our forthcoming anniversary, a target of £150,000 was set.

The Provincial Grand Master is delighted to announce that the Appeal, exceeded that amount by 56% and due to the generosity of Brethren, the total raised was:

**£234,835.00**

## Provincial History Book Launched amidst Corona Virus Pandemic

Back in 2016, when our present Provincial Grand Master was appointed, he felt that such a historic occasion should be celebrated with a book. Our Deputy Provincial Grand Master, WBro Dr Paul R Calderwood readily consented to become the compiler and editor of the Provincial History Book. This book

was to celebrate the 150th Anniversary of the oldest Mark Provincial Grand Lodge in Wales. This is the first time that a book has been published that brings together in a single volume a detailed description of the birth and development of every Mark and Royal Ark Mariner Lodge that has ever existed within the Province of South Wales.

It is a colourful hardback publication comprising 340 pages and over 200 illustrations.

It is a valuable source of information as well as a souvenir of this historic occasion.

It has the catchy title of 'The Mark of the Red Dragon'. Brethren from every Lodge of the Province have contributed under the guiding, watchful eye of Paul. His superb editing skills have resulted in a magnificent book, worthy of a place on every Brother's bookshelf.

### WBro Peter Gough, PJGD

With regret we report that WBro Peter Gough, PJGD passed to the Grand Lodge Above on Monday, 20 April at Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr, Ystrad Mynach after a short battle with Covid-19, aged 91.

Peter was Initiated into Loyal Commercial Lodge No.2720, Cardiff on 25 February 1950 - his father WBro Ernest Gough, PPrGPurs was Worshipful Master of the Lodge in 1946. Peter became WM in 1966 and again in 2010. He served as Lodge Secretary (1996-2002), and was Charity Steward (1995-2005) and (2007-09). When in 1997 Peter Initiated his son Layton, they became the only family to have three generations as members. Subsequently, on 16 February 2002, Peter Initiated his younger son Justin Peter Christian Gough, and the following year, he was afforded the privilege of Raising him. In 1991, it

was reported that Peter had found the first Past Master's Jewel in a Jeweller's in Cowbridge and had bought it to present to the Lodge.

Peter was also a Member of Hendre Lodge No.3250 and Lodge of Benevolence No.7305, where he was Charity Steward in 1999, Junior Warden in 2002 and WM in 2004. He was also a member of Proscenium Lodge No.9059 (1990-2016).

Exalted in Dovey Chapter No.2720 in November 1964, Peter became First Principal in 1972. He was a Founder Member of Llanfair Chapter No.7353 and was made an Honorary Member in 1994. He was also a Founder Member of Proscenium Chapter No.9059.

Peter was appointed Provincial Junior Grand Warden in 1984 and became a Grand Officer in 1988, with the rank of PAGDC. In 2005, he was appointed Provincial Senior Grand Warden, one of the few Brethren to have served actively as Junior and Senior Provincial Grand Wardens. In 2009, he was promoted in Grand Lodge to PJGD.
