

South Wales Mark Welcomes new Provincial Grand Master

he 4 June 2025 marked another milestone in the history
of the Mark Province of South Wales when a new
Provincial Grand Master RWBro Philip William Davies
was Installed as the 16th Provincial Grand Master of the
Province of South Wales.

The new Provincial Grand Master writes:

"The Mark Province in South Wales is the same geographical Province as our Craft and Chapter and is the third largest Masonic Order in English Freemasonry. We have thirty-two Mark Lodges and twenty-two Royal Ark Mariners Lodges in our Province and we enjoy excellent working relations with the Craft and Royal Arch".

"Just as in olden times, the Mark should be viewed as an essential step in a Freemason's progression. Membership of the Mark Degree is open to all Craft Brethren who have been Master Masons for at least four weeks. Full details of the Mark and the Royal Ark Mariner Degrees are available in leaflet format and on the Provincial website. In addition, you can scan a QR Code or using a search engine the 'Magic of the Mark'. The Mark Degree is commonly known as 'the friendly degree'.

I was delighted to welcome the Pro Grand Master Most Worshipful Brother John Herbert Prizeman to our Annual Provincial Meeting, for my Installation as the 16th Provincial Grand Master. He was elated with the warm Welsh welcome he received and we were equally pleased that he could visit our Province again."



"He has also again outlined the continuing bond between the Craft and the Mark and I would urge you all to support your Craft Lodges as they are the lifeblood of all our companion orders.

Charity being the distinguishing characteristic of a Freemason's heart, the Mark Benevolent Fund at both National and Provincial level continues to remind us that not all is well in the world.

"Suffering and tragedy have visited many over the past year and it is gratifying to know that we can play our part through the Mark Benevolent Fund by supporting those in need. This is only possible through the generosity of the Brethren and I again thank you all for your support of the Benevolent Funds at both local and national levels.

Desmond Barnett JP 1933 - 2025

Provincial Grand Master 1996-2008

rovincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons for South Wales offers sincere condolence to Elaine, Des' wife, their daughters and family.

RWBro Desmond (Des) Barnett JP, sadly passed to The Grand Lodge Above on 9 June 2025 aged 91 years. He was born in Treherbert in the Rhondda Valley and, amongst his many accomplishments, he was an outstanding athlete in his early years. He represented Wales in athletics in his teenage years and became the 200-yard Welsh record holder. Sadly, this promising career in athletics was cruelly cut short by an injury he sustained whilst he was an officer in the Royal Artillery.

Desmond was Appointed Provincial Grand Master in 1996 and held the office until 2008. He was Advanced in the Arthur Lewis Mark Lodge No.585 and became its Worshipful Master in 1982. He was Worshipful Commander of the Arthur Lewis Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners in 1989 and subsequently became a Joining Member of the South Wales Installed Mark Masters Lodge No.1201, becoming its Master in 1997 and similarly becoming Master of the De Cymru Mark Grand Officers Lodge No.1606 in 1997. Grand Rank recognition came in 1992 as AGDC. In 1995 as RAMGR and in 1995 as PGJD.

In the Craft Des was Appointed as PAGDC in 1997, which was followed in 2004 by Appointment as Junior Grand Deacon. In Holy Royal Arch he was Appointed in 1996 to the rank of Past Grand Standard Bearer. He also held Grand Rank in many other Companion Orders.

After the end of active participation, his love of sport continued in an administrative role when he became, for many years, Treasurer, Trainer (because of his medical background) and President of the Treherbert Rugby Football Club.

This involvement with local rugby presented him with the opportunity to become the Mid District Representative in the Rhondda Valley. Thus opening the door to becoming the youngest ever member of the Welsh Rugby Union Committee.

His proudest hour in Welsh Rugby came when, in his Presidential year, the Welsh Rugby Union team reached the semi-final of the first Rugby World Cup in New Zealand. He returned home to receive the accolades and cheers of his home town by being awarded Rhondda Sports-person of the Year.

During his term as Provincial Grand Master, the Province grew

from 26 to 29 Mark Lodges. He was the Consecrating Officer at the creation of the Cwm Rhondda Mark Lodge No.1812 in 2001, South Wales Mark Provincial Stewards Lodge No.1829 in 2003 and Trinity Mark Lodge No.1845 in 2004.

The number of RAM Lodges rose from 17 to 21. Consecrations carried out during his period of office included: Brychan RAM Lodge No.1725 in 1998, Llynfi Valley RAM Lodge No.1592 in 1998, De Čymru RAM Lodge No.1606 in 2003 and Cynon Dare RAM Lodge No.1590 in 2003.

He was also an Honorary Member of many Mark Lodges within our Province and without. He most certainly made his mark in the MARK with 52 years of membership.

RWBro Desmond was a good friend to us all. His leadership was as expected from a true Freemason and as we honour his memory, his leadership in our Order and Freemasonry is something we will never forget. Our thoughts and prayers are with Elaine and the family. He will indeed be greatly missed by many. Lived respected and died regretted. Let light perpetually shine on him and may he rest in peace and rise in glory.

South Wales Installed Mark Masters Support 'Maggie's' at Velindre

t the Installation Meeting of the South Wales Installed Mark Masters, SWIMM, it was unanimously agreed that the proceeds of the raffle would be donated to the Cancer Support Centre, Maggie's, at Velindre Hospital. When the Trustees of the South Wales Mark Benevolent Fund heard of this initiative they very generously agreed to top up the Installation raffle to £500

Go Maggie's is a charity that provides free expert care and support in centres across the UK and online. Their cancer support specialists, psychologists and benefit advisors are here for you and everyone you love. In every centre, you'll find a bright and welcoming space full of the kind of support that people facing cancer need and deserve. The Centre in Cardiff is such a place whether it be for being together or just being alone for a moment and meeting people who can help and support. All our cancer support specialists have expert knowledge about cancer and treatment, and many are NHS trained.

Our motto is: The kettle's already on – just come in. Welcome to Maggie's. Whatever kind of cancer and whatever stage you're at – we're here for you.

When Maggie was 47, she was diagnosed with breast cancer and five years later, in May 1993, she was told that it had returned and was given three months to live. After hearing this, Maggie and her husband Charles were moved to a windowless corridor where they were left to process the news. While sitting in the corridor they discussed the need for somewhere 'better' for people with cancer to go, outside of but nearby to the hospital.

Maggie joined an advanced chemotherapy trial and lived for another 18 months. During that time, she worked closely with her medical team, which included oncology nurse, Laura Lee, now Maggie's Chief Executive, to develop a new approach to cancer care.

Maggie believed it was important for people with cancer to be informed participants in their medical treatment and researched cancer centres across the world to find ways in which people could live better with cancer. She envisaged for the first centre a welcoming and positive space in which people with cancer and their family and friends, could meet other people in similar circumstances and receive support including advice on their treatment, how to manage stress and get psychological support.





Maggie was determined that people should not "lose the joy of living in the fear of dying" and the day before she died in July 1995, she sat in her garden, face to the sun and said: "Aren't we lucky?"

Who Was Maggie?

'Maggie Keswick Jencks' (1941-1995) was a writer, gardener and designer. With her father, she founded the Holywood Trust (South-West Scotland) and the Keswick Foundation (Hong Kong). Her book on Chinese Gardens is widely regarded as a classic on the subject and she was commissioned for many garden and interior design projects during her lifetime.

The following year, in November 1996, the first Maggie's Centre opened opposite the hospital where she was treated: the Western General in Edinburgh."
